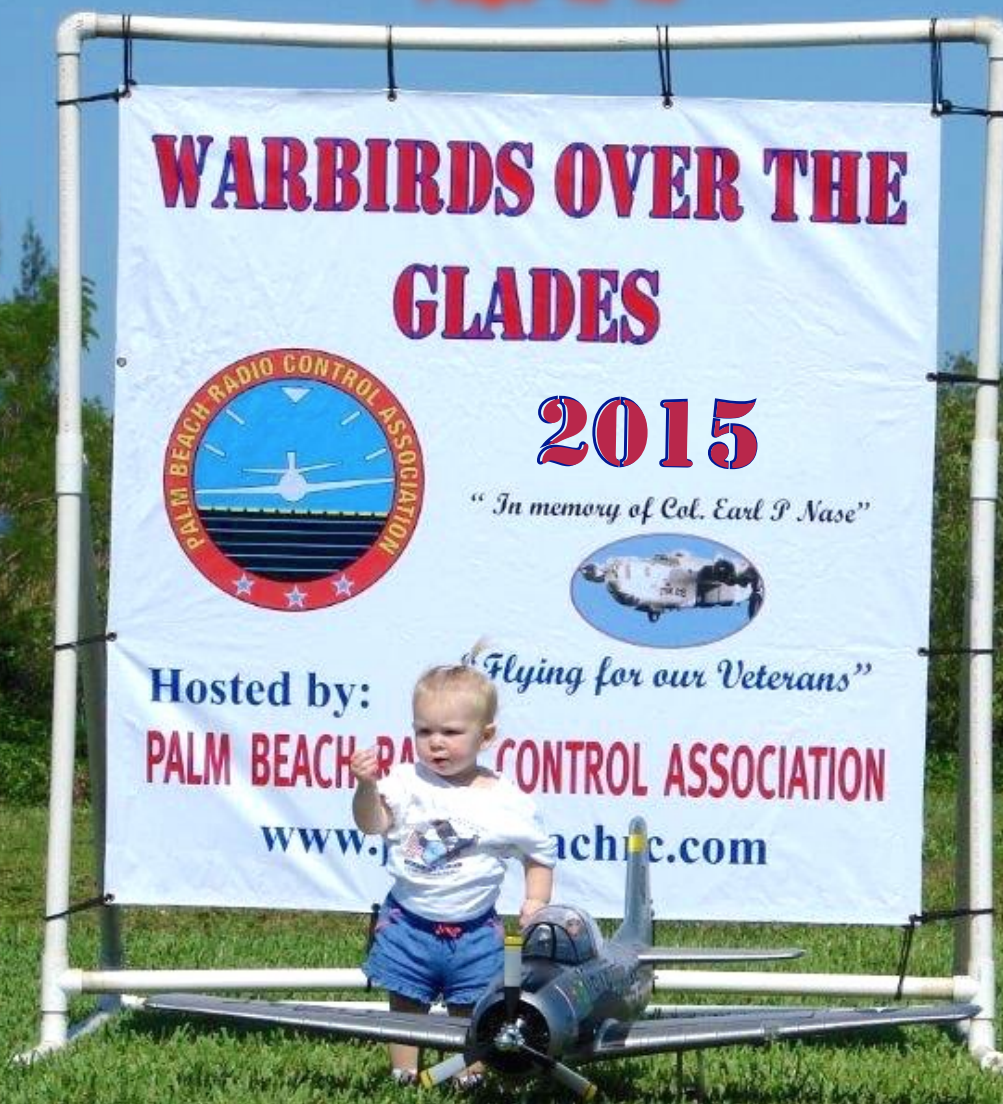

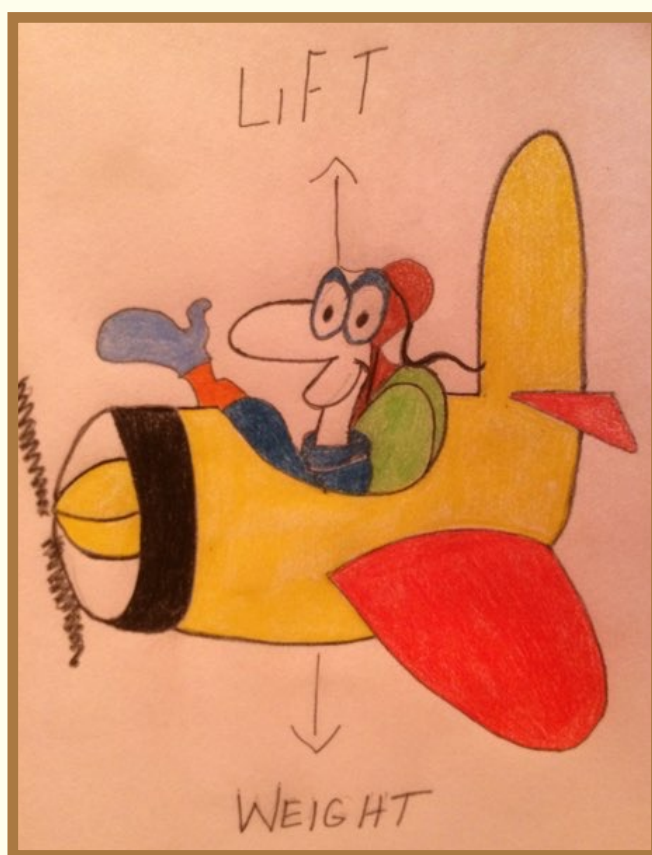
The President's Corner

The meeting was called to order at 7:30.

Susan was absent so Arty welcomed everyone.

The minutes from the April meeting were accepted as read by Seth.

The treasurer's report was accepted as read by Doug.

Several new members were introduced.

The Field Safety report was given by Glen, and he reminded everyone to avoid becoming dehydrated. Aerobatics can only be flown over the runway after getting permission of the other pilots. This includes making a low level, high speed pass. He also reminded everyone to fly the pattern in the same direction, even in the early morning sun.

The Chief Training Report was given by Jay, who asked experienced pilots to offer assistance to any other pilots who look like they may be in trouble. He also asked for more experienced pilots to volunteer as instructors.

Newsletter/Website: Pictures and articles are always welcomed!

2015 Events: The first ever Ladies Day Event on April 25th was very successful, with 38 ladies present, a lot of buddy box flying, good food and many requests to hold it again next year. The Warbirds event May 9th was another success, with 48 pilots, good food, and great weather. The Father's Day/Anniversary Day Fun Fly will be on Sun., June 21st, with flying limited to members only and featuring a bounce house and candy drop. And volunteers will be needed for the IMAC event on Sat. and Sun., Aug. 1st & 2nd.

Ground Maintenance: Painting of the picnic tables and press box is almost finished. The purchase of the new carports is on hold because of permitting and survey requirements. The Eagle Scout project to build 3 new engine startup stands is still in progress, and Hugo offered to repair 17 other stands at an approx. cost of \$21 each.

NEW BUSINESS: Multi-rotor (sUAV) flying at the field was discussed, including possible limits on their use, and the discussion will continue next month. A request for another handicap parking space will be considered. And we will again skip the July and August meetings as we did last year.

FLIGHT SAFETY

GLENN GELATT - FLIGHT SAFETY DIRECTOR

The HOT summer weather is here!

Be sure to bring lots of liquids to the field to keep hydrated.

If you have been feeling over tired and worn out when getting home, maybe have a head ache? It is likely you have not been drinking enough at the field and are getting dehydrated.

There were a few times when I was surprised recently by a plane landing or taking off right in front of me with no warning. When asked what was happening they said that they had called it, but I sure did not hear and I was at the middle of the line.

Remember you must be in the flight box, request permission from the other pilots in the box, and get a response from the other pilots on the flight line before entering the runway for take off and when landing or emergencies.

All stunt flying and high speed passes etc. require a request to do so from the others flying (which may be denied by anyone flying), and are to be kept out over the grass runway when others are flying. The pilots on the flight line are very close and this is making many very nervous when planes pass very closely down the centerline of the paved runway.

Remember, hand launches are to be done outside the pilot's box on the windward end flying away from the other pilots on the line.

Note, now that we have our new club cards and AMA cards remember you must always have them displayed in a visible location, on your person when north of the fence.

When crossing the runway always do so at a 90 degree angle to limit your time on the runway. No starting or minor repairs may be done on the runway; it must be cleared immediately! Call out to the other pilots in the box when entering and leaving the runway so that they will know when it is clear.

We all make mistakes and do unsafe things from time to time. Help your friends; remind them in a friendly manner after the flight is complete. If a person is unreceptive or combative refer it to the board members for review and consideration of appropriate action. There is no need to loose a friend.

Fly safe! We are all at the field to have fun safely!

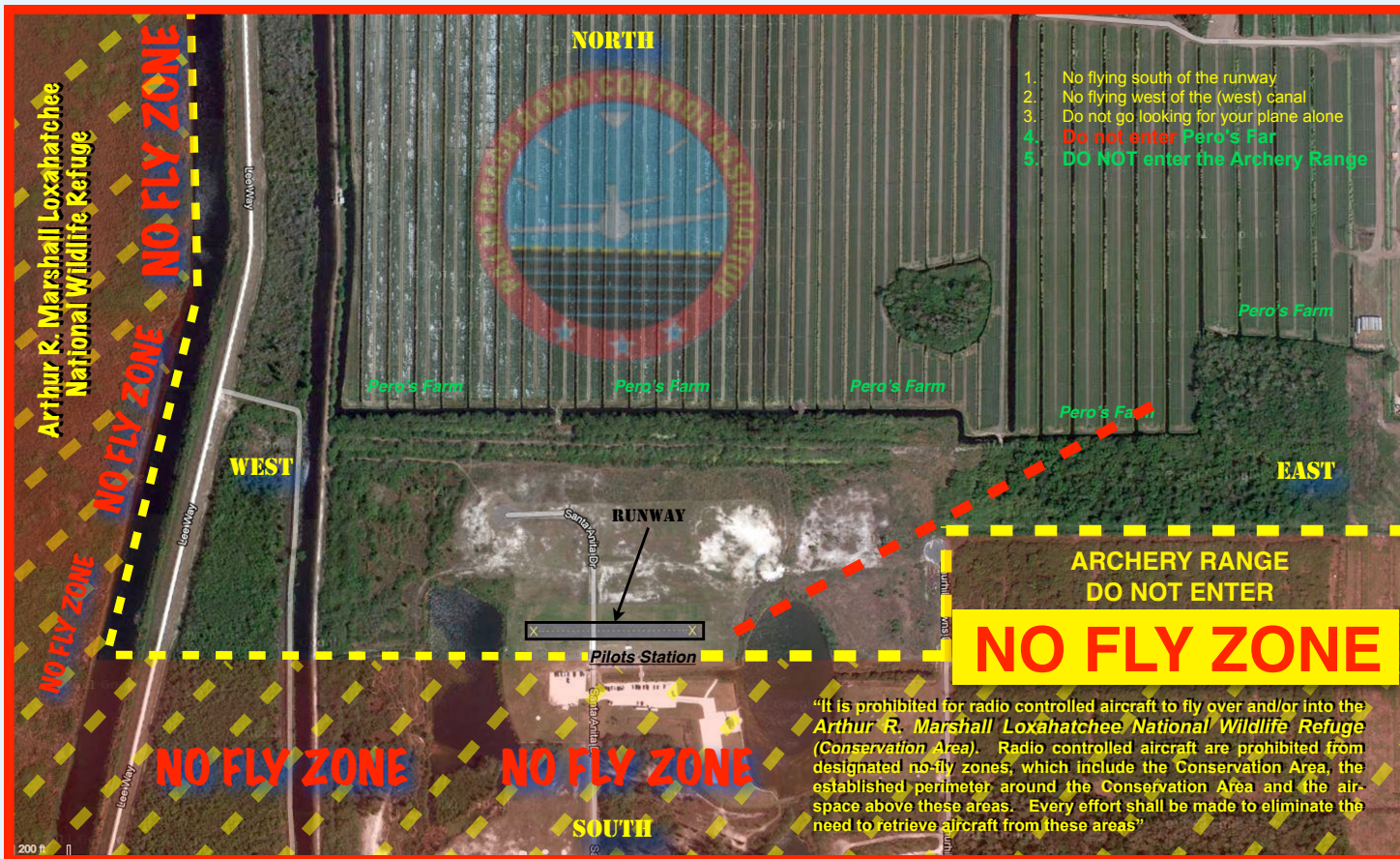

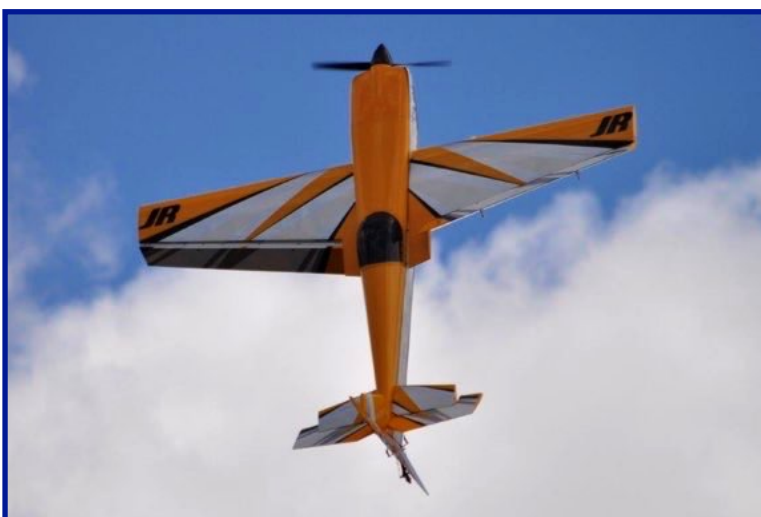

AFTER ACTION REPORT

After months of planning, preparation and plain hard work, the Palm Beach Radio Control Association hosted our warbird fly-in, "Warbirds Over the Glades" on May 9, 2015. We were truly blessed with a great weather day which made for a great turn out as we had pilots from many of our neighboring clubs as well as from around the state.

Forty-eight registered for the event bringing with them over 100 warbirds. Handling the registration process was our club Treasurer, Doug Christensen, with the assistance of President Sue Brassner. Upon registering, each pilot received an event T-shirt. Special thanks to Steve Westervelt, for once again, sponsoring the great event T-shirts as well as the polo shirts that were given to the staff.

After a brief pilots meeting in which we explained how we were going to run the flight line and flying boundaries, the call was made; **"HELMSMAN, TURN HER INTO THE WIND... PILOTS MAN YOUR AIRCRAFT ."** And a great day of flying was underway.

In an effort to make this even more inclusive it was decided to allow electric "foamie" warbirds as well as military scale helicopters which made for an interesting challenge for the flight line controllers Ed Christiansen, Mark Drogowitz, and Fran Arrigo. Thanks to the skill and knowledge of our flight line controllers and the patience and courtesy the pilots extended to each other things went remarkably well.

As is our tradition, each pilot received a commemorative photo with his airplane thanks to the efforts and generosity of Arty Mundell and the help of Bob Maran.

In the afternoon we were given a special treat as Dino DiGeorgio came to the event with the beautifully detailed giant scale Meister P-47 that he won the Pro-AM Prop division at TOP GUN the weekend before. He gave us a wonderful flight demonstration, really wringing out the old Jug. Some history on the plane; it was a plane that Dino's father had built 20 years ago and was used to make the fiberglass plugs for the new Meister P-47 fiberglass fuse kit. Needless to say, the plane was in really rough shape. Our own Doug Smith worked for months to get it back into flying shape. Then Dino finished the plane and super detailed it. I mean it has hot and cold running everything! If you didn't take the opportunity to take a good look at the plane you really missed something.

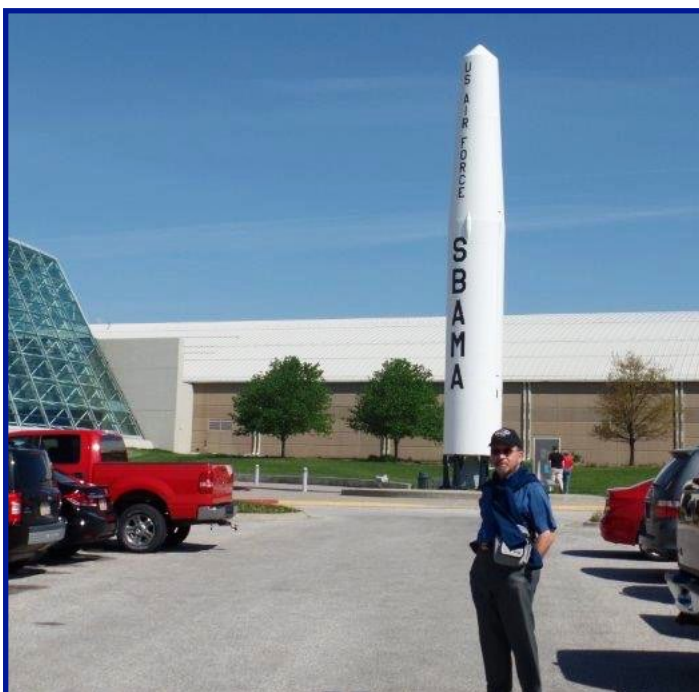

My wife and I spent a weekend in Omaha, NE recently. The main reason for going was to attend the Berkshire-Hathaway annual meeting. We were lucky to get a seat in the main arena with 20,000 others.

On Sunday, I decided to visit the Strategic Air Command Museum.....about 20 miles outside Omaha. It was fascinating. My photos tell the story of the variety and quantity of restored aircraft. The most impressive were the B-1 bomber out in the grass, and the SR-71 Blackbird in the entrance lobby. One other very interesting exhibit was the Jimmy Doolittle raid on Tokyo. They have 2 B-25's there. (Not any of Doolittle's because they all went down after the raid.) It is interesting to see how small the cockpit and the actual bombs were. What a surprise.

If any of you pilots get the chance to visit this museum.....grab it!!

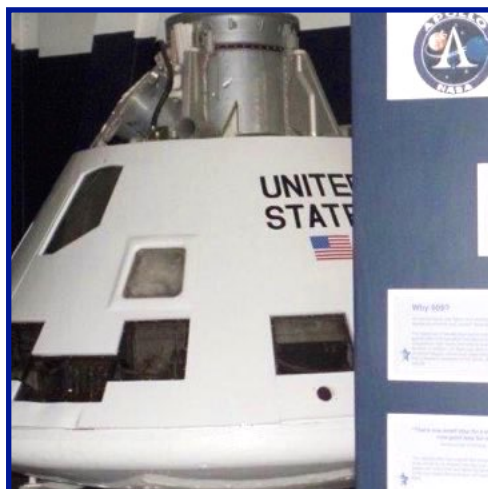
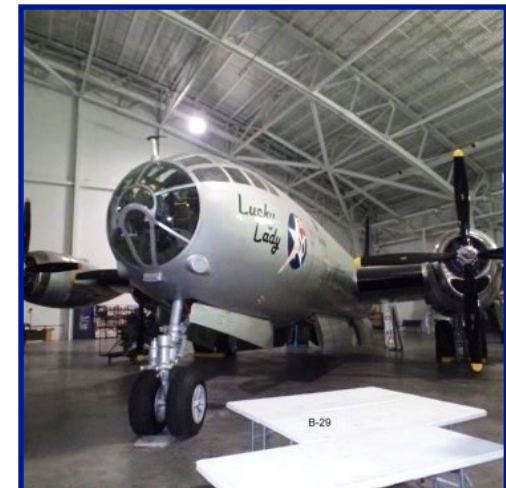

SAFETY TIPS:

1. Please do not linger on the runway when picking up your airplane. It is important that you vacate the runway as quickly as possible as long as its safe to move your airplane.
2. Do not park your airplane on the main taxiway, as it makes it difficult for pilots landing & taking off. Many parked planes have been struck on the taxiway. Be smart, park elsewhere.

Unmanned aircraft systems (UAS), or drones as they are often called, are increasingly available online and on store shelves. Prospective operators—from consumers to businesses—want to fly and fly safely, but many don't realize that, just because you can easily acquire a UAS, doesn't mean you can fly it anywhere, or for any purpose. "Know Before You Fly" is an educational campaign that provides prospective users with the information and guidance they need to fly safely and responsibly.

Know Before You Fly was founded by the three leading organizations with a stake in UAS safety – the Association for Unmanned Vehicle Systems International (AUVSI), the Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) and the Small UAV Coalition. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) is partnering with the founding members to spread the word about safe and responsible flying.

On February 15, 2015, the FAA [released](#) its [Notice of Proposed Rulemaking \(NPRM\) for small, unmanned aircraft](#). An NPRM is a public notice issued by law when an independent agency, such as the FAA, wishes to add, remove or change a rule or regulation as part of the rulemaking process. It **does not** change any existing guidelines, rules, regulations or policy that may be in place. Instead, it opens the door for public comment and the beginning of the rulemaking process.
